

# WaveContent: Content Strategy — ycombinator.com

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## Key Summary

YC's site relies heavily on brand authority but underperforms in content depth, SEO structure, and conversion optimization. High-impact opportunities exist in clarifying the \$500K funding structure, expanding international founder content, and capturing 'People Also Ask' search traffic.

### Key findings

- Homepage has only 67 words and no H1, limiting topical authority despite 50+ internal links per page; 'Companies' directory appears non-indexable due to client-side rendering.
- Core funding details (\$125K for 7% + \$375K MFN SAFE) are buried in bullets rather than featured prominently, creating confusion evident in high-volume PAA queries like 'how does Y Combinator actually fund startups?'
- International founders (80+ countries funded) face unclear guidance on incorporation and logistics, representing untapped global applicant pool.
- Competitors like Techstars and 500 Global outpace YC in content frequency (4-12 posts/month vs. YC's sparse updates) and multimedia formats, particularly video recaps and founder AMAs.

### Top opportunities

- Create 'The YC \$500K Deal Explained' guide with conversion scenarios to own the #1 PAA query and drive apply page conversions—pair with a homepage hero callout box.
- Launch 'International Founder's Playbook' targeting India/LATAM/Africa with incorporation steps and visa logistics to capture underserved 40%+ of potential applicants.
- Fix technical SEO on 'Companies' directory (ensure server-side rendering) and add Schema.org markup (Organization, InvestmentFund) to improve AI search visibility and rich snippets.

- Deploy weekly Twitter thread series ('YC Founder Tips') and LinkedIn carousels comparing YC vs. competitors to match Techstars' engagement rates (100K+ views) and feed top-of-funnel awareness.

- CTA: 'Apply for the Spring 2026 Batch' instead of just 'Apply'.

- Define a clear H1 heading.
- Reduce hero section link clutter.
- Add a summary of the standard investment deal (\$500k) to the hero.

- **Feature Callout:** 'The YC Deal: \$500,000 to fuel your growth.'

#### **Quick priority actions**

- Fix missing image alt text.
- Change all-caps H3s to title case for better readability.

- Ensure the directory is server-side rendered or has a static fallback for SEO.
- Add a descriptive H1: 'YC Startup Directory: Explore 4,000+ Startups'.
- Include a brief introductory paragraph about the diversity of the portfolio.

#### **Copy suggestions**

- **Title Tag:** 'YC Startup Directory | Search 4,000+ Funded Companies'

### **Quick priority actions**

## SEO & discoverability

### SEO insights

- The site relies heavily on brand authority rather than keyword-rich content.
- Internal linking is high (average 50+ per page), but often clustered in nav-heavy blocks rather than contextual body links.
- The 'Companies' directory appears to have indexability issues based on zero-content extraction.

### Discoverability signals

- Title tags are present but often generic (e.g., 'Y Combinator').

### LLM readability

- Increase the word count on the homepage to include key industry terms (accelerator, venture capital, seed funding).
- Ensure the 'Companies' directory content is visible to crawlers without JavaScript.

### Technical SEO notes

- Canonical tags are missing from the extraction, risking duplicate content issues.
- Meta robots are set to 'follow', which is good, but 'index' should be explicitly stated.
- Internal link samples show a flat structure, which is excellent for crawl depth.
